### BROOKS MEMORIAL LIBRARY Board of Trustees Regular Meeting Tuesday February 14, 2023 4:45 PM

#### Minutes

Present: Sirkka Kauffman, Starr Latronica, Karen Tyler, Sara Luttrell (technical services librarian/cataloging), Jennifer Rowe, Leo Schiff, Joyce Sullivan, Ann Varilly, John Woodward, Kate O'Connor, Howard Burrows.

Call to Order / 4:49 PM Leo Agenda/Changes or additions: None.

Public Comments: none.

Minutes of January 10, 2023: Karen moved to approve; Ann seconded. All who were in attendance voted to approve.

Leo introduced and the Board welcomed Sara Luttrell, the new cataloger.

#### COMMITTEE UPDATES/ DEPARTMENT REPORTS

- A. Friends of the Library-Starr update
- The annual appeal has raised about \$14,000 to date.
- They are looking into purchasing another Treasury bill.
- The next meeting will be devoted to budget preparation, with a focus on increasing funding for digital media, a laptop and creative software. Joyce will attend.
- B. Finance/Asset Development Committee—John Woodward, Chair
  - John reported on progress of the \$3,000 contract on the noticing and auction process of items in the Loud collection. The Brattleboro Historical Society may take some 20-25 items. We need to draw up notices and a press release of this effort. The first auction sale may take place in May or early summer. A low-end estimate of what we may realize from auction is \$20,000 less transaction costs.
  - Jenny reiterated that the final list for auction will be voted on by the Board for transparency.
  - Jenny noted that the quarterly report with benchmarks shows that at year end the endowment lost less than the benchmarks, but our stock portfolio lost more than Standard & Poor.
  - Jenny reported that Bob Fisher had requested a memo regarding the Brooks Building Fund history and transfer; Leo signed the document.
  - Jenny also presented a change to our Institutional funds policy to add this fund; it will be presented to the Board 3 times before giving it to the Town.

- C. Technology Committee
  - No report.
- D. Buildings and Grounds—Karen Tyler, Chair
  - Karen referred to the minutes in the packet. We are getting preliminary drawings for the outdoor roof designs. Staff has expressed concern about the lack of a cover on the book drop; Starr noted that Alec will look at it. Leo suggested that perhaps the high school building trades might take that on as a project. Lindsay has found a steel cabinet for the staff room.
- E. Advocacy and liaison to library organizations—Howard Burrows
  - Howard reminded the Board of the joint VLA and the VSLA April 3<sup>rd</sup> conference in Burlington, which will have a \$130 fee. He also referenced the statement from VLA on the Vermont State decision to use only digital library resources.
- F. Strategic Planning Committee Ann Varilly, Chair
  - Ann reported that the roll-out of the plan will be at the February 23 staff and trustee meeting, with a Powerpoint of the process of steps. Staff will brainstorm and then vote on 5 values, which will be the basis of a vision statement. Starr will meet later with the staff to plan activities.
- G. Nominating Committee Leo update
  - Five candidates have applied, 4 of whom have been scheduled for interviews on Saturday February 25, with one remaining to schedule. Joyce, Karen, Jenny, Leo and Starr will meet with the candidates.
- G. Department Reports: Director; Reference

#### **Director**

Starr reported during the recent meeting with State officials, one of them noted that there is language in a new bill to make libraries like schools in terms of the gun issue. Ann noted that she is researching a low vision monitor system with text to speech for a possible grant.

#### CONTINUING BUSINESS

• Discussion of possible library social worker:

The Town is interested in exploring a social worker/navigator resource, possibly overseen by the Safety Committee but available to the library and others.

• Succession plan for Board president

Leo will be away for March meeting, so John will chair as vice president. Leo said that it has been an honor to be president for the last three years, which is a good length of time. No one has stepped up yet privately, and he noted the basic skill is to run meetings,

which several Board members have done. Howard suggested that Strategic Planning has had good meetings and a strong leader. Leo noted that the president need not serve for 3 years, but possibly 2, and he could chair an active committee. Ann said she is willing to try it out, and would like to see the Technology Committee revitalized.

#### **Buildings and Grounds Committee**

Minutes of Meeting: 2/19/2023

- Called to order: at 9:18 AM. Present (in person or on Zoom) were Matt Wojcik, Starr Latronica, Lindsay Belville, Joyce Sullivan, Elizabeth Tannenbaum, Jane Southworth, Christine DeVallet, Sirka Kauffman, and Karen Tyler. Present from the public was Alec Goldschmid.
- Agenda was accepted as presented, except that discussion of the AARP Grant was moved to become part of discussion of the Outdoor Building Project

**Minutes** of the last meeting were accepted with one correction: that Christine's name be added to the list of those present.

- **Public Comment:** Alec was present specifically to discuss the outdoor building project, and had no additional comments.
- · Old Business: Outdoor Building Project

Matt screen-shared the drawing that Alec had sent us. In response to questions, he explained that the wall was split into two 18" sections to avoid an excessive drop, and would provide good seating. The construction notes address the drainage issue (Alec has met with DPW about location of drain). Concrete goes with the building, and provides a good surface for signage and/or artwork. The existing asphalt ramp will remain. The committe decided that it would be preferable to have the patio blocks abut rather than have grass in between, due to shade from roof. Joyce proposed plant boxes and/or pots; Lindsay pointed out that maintaining these might require staff time (volunteers might be available). Discussion of safety re: children on wall. Any options proposed would create further problems. Matt plans to look again at the area after the meeting.

Roofing options: Alec commented that it's a difficult building to roof. He likes separate sections, with small differences in elevation, which could relate to the existing roof. There are several problems with including solar panels on the new roof, but they could go on the south side of the existing building. (Town seems to think that would work.) Matt observed that the view from the teen room will change.

Alec and Adam could do an elevation drawing for cascading roofs so he can site point loads, which will determine location of conduits and outlets; will try to provide by March meeting. Design of roof structure should be finalized before proceeding.

AARP Community Challenge Grant: March 15 deadline to apply; project would have to be able to be completed by end of November. Alec says he can meet that time frame. However, we need approval of Board (for which we would require a special meeting) and possibly DRB as well as Selectboard (and still need an updated estimate), so this may not be realistic. Starrr says the VT Dept. of Libraries also has funds for capital projects.

The committee approved the concept of the design.

(At this point we had to move to the Staff Lounge due to another scheduled event, and some people either needed to leave or were unable to rejoin.)

- **Banners:** All present preferred Matt's design to the ones proposed by Lotus Graphics. Starr prefers blue background, and others agreed. Need to order stakes as well.
- Staff input re: building and furnishing needs
   Awaiting delivery of large cabinet; staff decided on blue. Placement in room to be determined.
- · New Business: none
- Adjourned at approximately 10:20. Next meeting: March 17, 2023 at 9:00 AM.

Town communications director may also be solicited by Starr before publication.

The director of the Vermont Department of Libraries (Steve Perkins) is scheduled for a March 23 site visit to inspect the items they are interested in taking custody of. Perkins has been in communication with Schlegel to ensure exclusivity between the auctionable items and the transferrable items. There has not been an update from Schlegel regarding potential auction timelines in light of the new interest from DOL. John will inquire when he shares the drafted public noticing language with Schegel.

Jenny agreed to investigate the information resources provided by the Vermont Historical Society as part of a "virtual roundtable" on museum property law topics, which Starr and Ann attended. This could provide guidance as to the appropriate breadth and depth of effort the Board should extend to inform individual donors of the changes being contemplated for the collection.

No update on status of Brattleboro Historical Society's preparation to take custody of the various documents, prints, artefacts, etc. of interest to them. They many need to schedule another site visit before fully committing.

### Director's Report for March 2023

**Announcements:** We had to close the library during the recent snow events. Many thanks to DPW for clearing the roads and sidewalks so people could get here ASAP. In the ensuing days we saw hours when every table and outlet was in use by people with no power and/or Internet at home who relied on the library to conduct business and communicate with loved ones.

We are so grateful for the support and assistance of Seth Thomas. He is helping us format our new strategic plan and advising us on Instagram and other avenues of promotion. We have seen an increased awareness of library services and events within the community.

**Building and Grounds:** Thanks to Russ Brown and Pete Lynch for moving forward with the upgrade of our fire alarm with corresponding work that needs to be done at the Transportation Center. We are investigating grants available for capital projects in libraries through the VT Department of Libraries. We are working on projects to construct a roof shelter for the exterior bookdrop to allow for safe retrieval of materials during inclement weather and an outdoor seating area for expanded use of wi-fi during good weather and outside of library hours.

Community Collaborations: Leo and I met with some staff and Board members of Groundworks to begin planning a community forum on homelessness. The Vermont State Representatives continue their monthly meetings in the Community Room to discuss local and state issues with constituents. Acclaimed author, Gennarose Nethercott is conducting a writing class for unhoused individuals. Staff issued library cards to parents and children at Academy School during parent teacher conferences. Senior staff met with members from the Justice Center to move forward with restoring a trespassed individual's library privileges.

Programs/displays: We hosted an opening for 6 artists who are exhibiting floral watercolors along the mezzanine panels. The paintings are wonderful harbingers of spring and appreciated by everyone who views them. Teen game night drew over 50 participants, several with special needs and their attendants. This is the only kind of activity that does not require an admission fee or paid membership that occupies teens on a Friday evening, is substance free, educational and builds positive social and emotional connection. Teen programming and services are essential to the wellbeing and the future of this community. The science fiction reading group is going strong and we are purchasing many new and classic titles to support this interest. *Sing and Dance with Robin* continues and preschool Rhyme Time has resumed. Our partners at Edible Brattleboro continue their series of demonstrations on using food preparation objects from the Library of Things. Our robust partnership with Windham World Affairs Council has expanded our programming, both in-person and online.

Continuing Education/Professional Development: Three staff members, Jeni Clary, Jen Robb and Amanda Whiting, completed the core reference class in their pursuit of certification by the Vermont Department of Libraries, which will enhance their service to the public. Jeni Clary has been accepted to participate in the advanced tier New England Library Leadership Symposium! Sara Lutrell, cataloger continues to explore training in Koha cataloging, procedures and reports—to the benefit of the entire staff.

**Trustee activities:** Nikki Holland was elected to fill the remaining two years of a vacated term. Jennifer Rowe and John Woodward, Karen Tyler were all re-elected for three-year terms. and The Strategic Planning document is nearly complete. Progress continues on relocating art, artifacts and documents that will be appreciated elsewhere.

**Town activities:** Representative Town meeting offered the opportunity to chat with constituents and hear the concerns and priorities of the attendees.

### Service at the Help Desk

The coming of spring seemed to inspire a lot of people to seek services at the Help Desk, and there was a lot of good collaboration among staff to meet the need. So, my March report is intended to give a sense of the breadth, depth, and volume of Help Desk work, and how we get it done.

A random Help Desk snapshot: Saturday, March 18<sup>th</sup>, 2023

I happened to choose this date to log reference transactions I handled at the Help Desk—a check I do from time to time. The questions show the variety of interests and needs that patrons bring to the library, plus some of the sources we accessed.



- Who's the author who wrote Russian detective novels who wasn't Stuart Kaminsky? NoveList (Martin Cruz Smith)
- Do we have archives of process, history around the construction of Vermont Yankee? -No, but we went together to the NRC library page, which includes the searchable ADAMS database + links to contact at NRC library for things not digitized + the VSARA newspapers database for the news articles
- Backgammon -No dedicated book here, but patron was happy to browse games in the 700s
- Detailed reader's advisory: **DH Lawrence, Irish Catholic fiction, Proust translations** -Drew from patron's interests, NoveList, and librarian knowledge of library collection
- Menopause and endocrine system, especially adrenal disease, for the patient -Medlineplus,
   Health & Wellness Resource Center, Worldcat for ILL, our section 618.1
- 2023 IRS forms off the beaten path -Online, printed
- **Contact information for Patrick Leahy** post-Senate, to write him a letter about his book -*Tried several avenues and ended at Simon & Schuster's publicity department, which will forward correspondence to their authors. Got title and salutation etiquette from US Dept. of State*
- Saving resume in pdf format on a personal Mac to send to our printer -Jeni & Jeanne team
- **Kanopy diagnostics** -Worked together over the phone, but patron kept getting to screens that blocked access—we'll connect next week in person.
- History of color theory/impact of the rainbow of colors on emotion and in art and culture,
   for a theater piece -Our collection + Gale eBooks + CLN

#### Staff collaboration at the Help Desk

#### Interlibrary loan

Jen and Jeanne share requests back and forth, e.g. patron wants a rare book about the rumored haunted house in Gardner, and only one library in the U.S. has it, so Jeanne finds articles from Massachusetts newspapers.

Jen keeps expanding her research skills so she can find the full array of formats: books, articles, referrals to databases.

Jen shares tips with Jeanne about how to shake the big, leafy tree of ILL that extends throughout the U.S. and into Canada.



#### **Technical Services**

Jen, Jeanne, Marybeth, and Sara share information and work on

- Suggestions for Purchase: recent, to add to our collection
- ILL: older than 6 months, and not in our consortium
- 'ILL Select': ILL requests that reveal gaps or collection development opportunities in our collection, so we might purchase a title through Everyone's that isn't brand new.

#### **Circulation desk**

Staffers practice the art of guiding a patron toward the Help Desk for detailed assistance without making them feel like they're being brushed off.

Sometimes Information Services and Circulation Services staff members switch stations very publicly, in a friendly spirit, to get the right help to each patron.

Reader's advisory tools keep expanding, thanks to Circ Manager and her staff: treasured hand-written lists on legal pads, themed book-cover roundups in the weekly newsletters, graphics-enhanced displays on the first floor, and curated lists in our Aspen catalog.

Cordial, respectful help with basic needs questions: free meals, bus schedule, may I use the portable phone?

Technology help, especially with our own computers, fax, and printer-copier-scanner with all its fancy tricks—plus additional elegant guiding of patrons toward the Electronic Services Specialists for help with broader tech needs.

#### **Electronic Services**

Matt and Jeanne share a common boundary and trade responsibility for specific questions all the time. They also expand each other's knowledge in their two areas of expertise.

Matt supports circulation staffers in their work to assist patrons with technology.

On everybody's wish list: more time/better tools to keep each other informed about all of this work, so that we can multiply the benefit of our efforts, avoid duplication, and make sure we don't miss any requests.

#### Youth Services Board Report- April 2023

In March, we celebrated our furry friends during *Paws to Read* month. We had the ever friendly and patient Kelso the dog visit us on Tuesday afternoons in March for our Read to a Dog program. Kids of all ages were excited to share a book with Kelso, with some kids bringing their favorite book from home!

This year, for the first time, we went to Academy School during Parent/ Teacher Conferences. On Friday March 24 and Monday March 27 from noon until 3:30, we signed up almost 30 students for library cards! We also had students enter their name for a free book. We gave away books to six lucky winners.

Sing and Dance with Robin began in February and will continue through the end of April. We have seen our usual influx of Robin fans netting around 20 kids and 20 parents per session!

We have also brought back our monthly LEGO-Palooza event – a crowd favorite – and have seen some beautiful sculptures by artists of all ages.

We are currently in the swing of Month of the Young Child and are preparing for a fun philosophy events for kids as well as a some Spring Break Fun J

In March, the Teens broke from our regular schedule to hold a special game night \*by request of the high schoolers\* to the tune of 50 teenagers (probably more, but they were all moving in and out all night and Chloë lost track after we hit 50). It was Max's first teen event to work! We've been seeing some attendance at game nights by autistic teens (coming with their support staff in tow) and everyone so far has had a great time.

In addition to our regular Teen Writing Games workshop, we also held a second All-Ages creative writing workshop "Create in Community" run by Senior TAFLTS member Anna Cummings and local poet Diana Whitney. Adults and teens alike wrote, shared, and supported each other in writing creatively.

Notice of Deaccession Language [to be published in BML newsletter, local presses, other?]

It may come as a surprise to some that Brooks Memorial Library (BML) possesses a modest collection of fine and decorative arts and other collectibles accumulated over a century through unsolicited donations, bequests, and artist's gifts. The most significant and regionally relevant paintings, sculptures, and photographs have been on display throughout the library for many years. Unfortunately, most of the donated items must be kept in storage because BML lacks both the space to display additional items and the human and financial resources required to adequately maintain curated displays.

Over the past several years, the BML Board of Trustees, in keeping with its fiduciary responsibilities, has debated what should be done with the many items that the library has limited capacity to make available to the public or properly maintain in storage. Through these conversations, informed by the recently completed strategic planning process and ancillary outreach efforts, we have learned that the Brattleboro community members place a high value on access to public gathering and meeting places within the library building.

For these reasons, the Board of Trustees has been exploring possibilities for releasing the majority of stored fine and decorative arts and artifacts to different owners, with the twin goals of, 1) providing more appropriate nearby homes for regionally significant items, and, 2) reconfiguring our space to accommodate patron use. Achieving these goals will require a combination of transfers of items to more appropriate institutions like the Brattleboro, Windham County, and Vermont Historical Societies, or other regional museums, and auction sales of items that cannot be placed with local or regional custodians. The BML Trustees are working closely with an independent fine arts consultant as well as experts at the Vermont Historical Society to navigate the technicalities and logistics of what is formally called "deaccessioning," with the explicit intention to ensure items that significantly relate to Vermont are retained within the state.

The Brattleboro and surrounding communities should expect to see several announcements over the coming months about the status of the Board's deaccessioning process. For any item without a known donor we are required by Vermont law to publicly solicit third-party evidence of ownership before relinquishing the property to another entity.
